

Renewing your Utah License or Identification Card on or after January 1, 2010?

You will need to provide the following documentation:

To ensure your process is as smooth as possible, please remember the following:

- ✓ Double check that you have all the correct documentation before visiting a Driver License office.
- ✓ Documents must be an original or a copy certified by the issuing agency.

- ✓ Faxed or photocopied documents will NOT be accepted.
- ✓ Any name or address variation from your current certificate must be accompanied by legal authorizing documentation identifying the updated information (marriage, divorce or court order).
- ✓ Documents are subject to departmental review and approval. Additional information may be required.

- ✓ In some cases, document approval may not occur in the same day and may require an additional visit.
- ✓ All documents provided to the Division will be imaged and stored in a secure database and will be returned to the applicant.

Driving Privilege Card (DPC)

Present the following:

1. One legal/lawful presence document from column 1; and
2. One identity document from column 2 (may be same as legal/lawful presence document); and
3. Evidence of social security number (SSN) or proof of ineligibility to obtain a SSN from column 3; and
4. Evidence of Utah residency if the address is different from your current Utah certificate from column 4 (must provide two documents)

Present the following:

1. One legal/lawful presence document from column 1; and
2. One identity document from column 2; and
3. Evidence of social security number (SSN) or proof of ineligibility to obtain a SSN from column 3; and
4. Evidence of Utah residency if the address is different from your current Utah certificate from column 4 (must provide two documents)

Present the following:

1. Two identity documents from column 2 (one must be a foreign birth certificate including a certified translation if the birth certificate is not in English); and
2. Evidence of social security number (SSN) or evidence of an Individual Tax Identification Number (ITIN) from column 3; and
3. Evidence of Utah residency if the address is different from your current certificate from column 4 (must provide two documents)

- Pending or approved application for asylum in the United States; - Admission into the United States as a refugee; - Pending or approved application for temporary protected status in the United States; - SSA-1099 form; - Non SSA-1099 form; - Pay stub showing the applicant's name and SSN; or - Other documents approved by DHS or the Division Director or designee. - Letter from the Social Security Administration indicating ineligibility to receive a Social Security Number <p><u>DPC only</u> Individual Tax Identification Number (ITIN) issued by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS); Utah Residency Verification</p> </div> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Two documents which display the applicant's name and principle Utah residence address including: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Bank statement (dated within 60 days); - Court documents; - Current mortgage or rental contract; - Major credit card bill (dated within 60 days) - Property tax notice (statement or receipt dated within one year); - School transcript (dated within 90 days) - Utility bill (billing date within 60 days), (cell phone bills will not be accepted); - Valid Utah vehicle registration or title; - Other documents acceptable to the Division upon review, except that only one document printed from the internet may be accepted.
